NATURE JOURNALING

Nature journals are a place to write and draw your observations and feelings about your experiences in nature. You can include sketches of plants and animals, questions you have, poems, and more in a journal.

Use this journal to record your garden discoveries. Remember to use your sense of sight, hearing, touch, and smell as you journal.

DID YOU KNOW?

Botanists, scientists who study plants, use nature journals to record their important discoveries. They call them field notebooks. These notebooks hold measurements, data, observations, sketches, and pressed plants.
